CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

from Hebrews 10 and Jeremiah 31

M Brethren, we now have boldness to enter the holy place by the blood of Jesus,

C by a new and living way which He opened for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh,

M And since we have a high priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith. Having our hearts sprinkled with His blood and our bodies washed in holy baptism, we are freed from a guilty conscience.

M Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.

C And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works,

M not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some,

C but exhorting one another, and so much the more as we see the Day approaching.

M Let us pray, O Lord, in this wondrous Sacrament You have left us a remembrance of Your passion. Grant that we may so receive the sacred mystery of Your body and blood that the fruits of Your redemption may continually be manifest in us; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy spirit one God, now and forever. one God, now and forever.

John 13:1–17,31–35

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.

² And supper being ended, the devil having already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's *son*, to betray Him, ³ Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God, ⁴ rose from supper and laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself. ⁵ After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe *them*

with the towel with which He was girded. ⁶ Then He came to Simon Peter. And *Peter* said to Him, “Lord, are You washing my feet?”

⁷ Jesus answered and said to him, “What I am doing you do not understand now, but you will know after this.”

⁸ Peter said to Him, “You shall never wash my feet!”

Jesus answered him, “If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me.”

⁹ Simon Peter said to Him, “Lord, not my feet only, but also *my* hands and *my* head!”

¹⁰ Jesus said to him, “He who is bathed needs only to wash *his* feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you.” ¹¹ For He knew who would betray Him; therefore He said, “You are not all clean.”

¹² So when He had washed their feet, taken His garments, and sat down again, He said to them, “Do you know what I have done to you?”

¹³ You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for *so* I am. ¹⁴ If I then, *your* Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. ¹⁵ For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. ¹⁶ Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. ¹⁷ If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. ...

³¹ “Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in Him.

³² If God is glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in Himself, and glorify Him immediately. ³³ Little children, I shall be with you a little while longer. You will seek Me; and as I said to the Jews, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come,’ so now I say to you. ³⁴ A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵ By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.”

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Blessed are You , O Lord our God, king of all creation, for You have had mercy on us and given Your only-begotten Son that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.

A Service of the Sacrament



RESPONSIVE READING

1 Corinthians 11:23–32

- M For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you:
C that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread;
M and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said,
C “Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.”
M In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying,
C “This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.”
M For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup,
C you proclaim the Lord’s death till He comes.
M Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner
C will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.
M But let a man examine himself,
C and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup.
M For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner
C eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord’s body.

A, B, C’s of Self-Examination

- A – *Assess your sins by examining yourself in view of the 10 commandments and your station in life.*
- M I now invite you to examine your place in life according to the Ten Commandments. Have you been faithful as a father, mother, husband, wife, son, daughter, employer or employee, citizen, pastor, member, and servant to those neighbors the Lord has put into your daily life? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you injured anyone by what you have said or done? Have you stolen anything, neglected your duty, been careless, or damaged anything? *(moment of silence for self-examination)*
- B – *Believe in Jesus by hearing His promised forgiveness in the words of institution and by receiving the bodily presence of Jesus in the bread and wine of holy communion. (Matt. 26, Mk 14, Lk 22, 1 Cor. 11)*
- M Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and, when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, ‘Take, eat. This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.’ In the same way He took the cup, after supper, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, ‘Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.’
- C – *Confess the faith by speaking and singing the praises of God in love and unison with likeminded believers (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1:10; 11:26)*
- M The cup of blessing which we bless,
C is it not the communion of the blood of Christ?
M The bread which we break,
C is it not the communion of the body of Christ?
M For we, though many, are one bread and one body;
C for we all partake of that one bread.
M Therefore, let there be no divisions among us,

C But let us be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.

M For as often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

C Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

M O Christ, Thou Lamb of God, You take away the sin of the world,

C Have mercy on us. Amen.
