from Ps. 38; Is. 53; Hb. 9; Ps. 111

The Betrayal

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

- M Who has believed our report?
- C And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?
- M For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant,
- C And as a root out of dry ground.
- M He has no form or comeliness;
- C And when we see Him, There is no beauty that we should desire Him.
- M He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief.
- C And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him;

(2) John 18:12-27

Before the High Priest

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

- M He was despised,
- C and we did not esteem Him.
- M Surely He has borne our griefs
- C And carried our sorrows;
- M Yet we esteemed Him stricken,
- C Smitten by God, and afflicted.

Sing:

They crown Thy head with thorns, they smite, they scourge Thee; With cruel mockings to the cross they urge Thee; They give Thee gall to drink, they still decry Thee; They crucify Thee.

(3) John 18:28-40

Before Pilate

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

- M But He was wounded for our transgressions,
- C He was bruised for our iniquities;
- M The chastisement for our peace was upon Him,
- C And by His stripes we are healed.
- M All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way;
- C And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Sing

What punishment so strange is suffered yonder! The Shepherd dies for sheep that loved to wander; The Master pays the debt His servants owe Him, Who would not know Him.

(4) John 19:1-16

Before the People

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

- M He was oppressed and He was afflicted,
- C Yet He opened not His mouth;
- M He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent,
- C So He opened not His mouth.
- M He was taken from prison and from judgment,
- C And who will declare His generation?
- M For He was cut off from the land of the living;
- C For the transgressions of My people He was stricken.

Sing

The sinless Son of God must die in sadness; The sinful child of man may live in gladness; Man forfeited his life and is acquitted, --God is committed.

(5) John 19:17-30

The Crucifixion

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

- M And they made His grave with the wicked—
- C But with the rich at His death,
- M Because He had done no violence,
- C Nor was any deceit in His mouth.
- M Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him;
- C He has put Him to grief.
- M When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days,
- C And the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand.
- M He shall see the labor of His soul,
- C and be satisfied.

Sing

O wondrous love, whose depth no heart hath sounded, That brought Thee here, by foes and thieves surrounded! All worldly pleasures, heedless, I was trying While Thou wert dying.

(6) John 19:31-42

The Burial

RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

M By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many,

C For He shall bear their iniquities.

- M Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great,
- C And He shall divide the spoil with the strong,
- M Because He poured out His soul unto death,
- C And He was numbered with the transgressors,
- M And He bore the sin of many,
- C And made intercession for the transgressors.

John 18:36–38

³⁶Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now My kingdom is not from here."

³⁷ Pilate therefore said to Him, "Are You a king then?"

Jesus answered, "You say *rightly* that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."

³⁸ Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" And when he had said this, he went out again to the Jews, and said to them, "I find no fault in Him at all.
