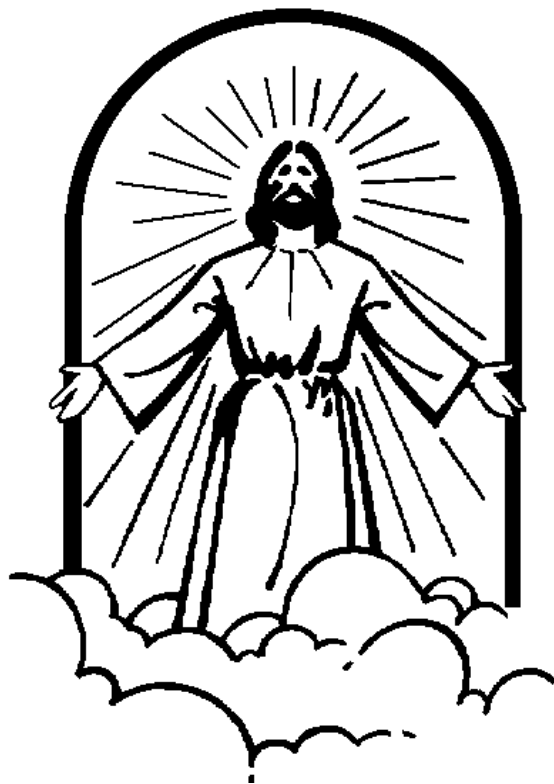


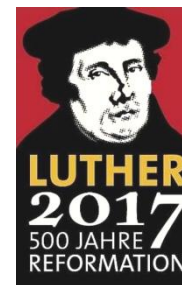

The Fifth Sunday After Pentecost

“The LORD is my strength and song; He also has become my salvation.” (Isaiah 12:2b)

PRESERVICE MEDITATION: Psalm 28, page 129 (The Lutheran Hymnal)

FIRST LESSON: Acts 7:54 - 8:3

⁵⁴When they heard these things they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed at him with *their* teeth. ⁵⁵But [Stephen], being full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, ⁵⁶and said, “Look! I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!” ⁵⁷Then they cried out with a loud voice, stopped their ears, and ran at him with one accord; ⁵⁸and they cast *him* out of the city and stoned *him*. And the witnesses laid down their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹And they stoned Stephen as he was calling on *God* and saying, “Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.” ⁶⁰Then he knelt down and cried out with a loud voice, “Lord, do not charge them with this sin.” ^{8:1}Now Saul was consenting to his death. At that time a great persecution arose against the church which was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. ²And devout men carried Stephen *to his burial*, and made great lamentation over him. ³As for Saul, he made havoc of the church, entering every house, and dragging off men and women, committing *them* to prison.

PSALM OF THE DAY (*responsively*) – from Psalm 40

M: I waited patiently for the LORD; and He inclined to me, and heard my cry.

C: HE ALSO BROUGHT ME UP OUT OF A HORRIBLE PIT, OUT OF THE MIRY CLAY, AND SET MY FEET UPON A ROCK, AND ESTABLISHED MY STEPS.

M: He has put a new song in my mouth – praise to our God; many will see it and fear, and will trust in the LORD.

C: BLESSED IS THAT MAN WHO MAKES THE LORD HIS TRUST, AND DOES NOT RESPECT THE PROUD, NOR SUCH AS TURN ASIDE TO LIES.

M: Many, O LORD my God, are Your wonderful works which You have done; and Your thoughts toward us cannot be recounted to You in order;
C: IF I WOULD DECLARE AND SPEAK OF THEM, THEY ARE MORE THAN CAN BE NUMBERED.
M: I delight to do Your will, O my God, and Your law is within my heart.
C: I HAVE PROCLAIMED THE GOOD NEWS OF RIGHTEOUSNESS IN THE GREAT ASSEMBLY; INDEED, I DO NOT RESTRAIN MY LIPS, O LORD, YOU YOURSELF KNOW.
M: Do not withhold Your tender mercies from me, O LORD;
C: LET YOUR LOVINGKINDNESS AND YOUR TRUTH CONTINUALLY PRESERVE ME.

SECOND LESSON: Luke 17:1-10 *rise*

¹ Then He said to the disciples, "It is impossible that no offenses should come, but woe to *him* through whom they do come! ² It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were thrown into the sea, than that he should offend one of these little ones. ³ Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him. ⁴ And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, 'I repent,' you shall forgive him." ⁵ And the apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." ⁶ So the Lord said, "If you have faith as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be pulled up by the roots and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. ⁷ And which of you, having a servant plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and sit down to eat'? ⁸ But will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for my supper, and gird yourself and serve me till I have eaten and drunk, and afterward you will eat and drink'? ⁹ Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. ¹⁰ So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.'"

SERMON: Isaiah 12

THE LORD IS MY STRENGTH AND MY SONG!

¹ And in that day you will say: "O LORD, I will praise You; though You were angry with me, Your anger is turned away, and You comfort me. ² Behold, God *is* my salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; 'For YAH, the LORD, *is* my strength and song; He also has become my salvation.'" ³ Therefore with joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. ⁴ And in that day you will say: "Praise the LORD, call upon His name; declare His deeds among the peoples, make mention that His name is exalted. ⁵ Sing to the LORD, for He has done excellent things; this *is* known in all the earth. ⁶ Cry out and shout, O inhabitant of Zion, for great *is* the Holy One of Israel in your midst!"
